



Consultation with Māori on a research project: Guidelines for Tae Ora Tinana involvement

When to consult Tae Ora Tinana

Tae Ora Tinana considers that it **is** an appropriate consultative Māori body if your research falls into all of the following circumstances:

- The research is about professional issues involving Physiotherapy.
- The research participants are physiotherapists.
- The research is a National project.

When not to consult Tae Ora Tinana

Research **not** considered appropriate for evaluation by Tae Ora Tinana:

- The research participants are members of the community.
- The research is a local project.

The template on the following page will help the kaitiaki of Tae Ora Tinana decide if they are the appropriate body to provide feedback on your proposal.
