Online Learning

Online learning modules include:

- The complex shoulder

- Glenohumeral and scapula function
- Nociplastic pain
- Sensorimotor control of the shoulder

Practical Course

In this 2-day practical course you will cover:

- Sensorimotor assessment and rehabilitation
 - sensory perception
 - · tactility and 2-point discrimination
 - proprioception
 - mirror testing
- Assessment and rehabilitation of factors that influence sensorimotor processing:
 - nociplastic pain
 - psychosocial factors
 - neurodevelopmental factors and retained primitive reflexes
- Cortical activation and progressive rehabilitation
- Prioritising management in complex shoulder presentations.
- Rehabilitation case studies
