- 2. Current photo. This should be a current hi-resolution digital photo of yourself.
- 3. Full curriculum vitae (CV).
- 4. Statement of any known or perceived conflicts of interest.

- 250 word biography
- Details of any conflicts of interest
- Full curriculum vitae (CV)
