Critical health workers can travel here now.

These include registered health practitioners, nurses, paramedics, technical & support staff and more.





The border exceptions regime will be phased out from 31 July 2022.

Rebalance objectives

- support shift to a more productive economy
- shift to a higher skilled migrant workforce
- encourage employers to look to the domestic workforce

Immigration Rebalance

A Green List will make it easier for employers to hire and attract migrants for high-skilled, hard-to-fill positions in Global demand

Median wage will be the main pay threshold for migrants but there will be limited exceptions

Businesses are encouraged to do more to attract, train, upskill and hire New Zealand workers

New sector agreements will provide short-term or ongoing access to lower-paid migrants







The introduction of the Green List makes it easier for employers to attract and hire migrants into specific roles, with residence pathways and a simplified application process.

Won't require proof of advertising as part of the job check

Migrants will go on the fast-tracked, straight-to-residence path or a 2-year work-to-residence path

Other eligible migrant workers will be able to apply for Skilled Migrant Category Resident Visa
